### **Greetings MESA Eagles,**

The weather outside is swiftly transitioning, and the fall season is a reminder of how things quickly change. The one thing that remains constant is the school and home connection. I would like to personally thank you for trusting us to educate your scholar at MESA. We promise to provide our scholars with a high quality education which embraces the whole child. This year we welcomed 113 new scholars to MESA. It is my goal to meet our new families and become acclimated with our returning families. Please note and save the following dates to meet with the school principal for pancakes with the principal:

- November 3, 2023 Primary parents of scholars in grades K-2, 8:30-10:00
- November 10, 2023 Intermediate parents of scholars in grades 3-5, 8:30-10:00
- November 17, 2023 Middle school parents of scholars in grades 6-8, 8:30-10:00

We will have breakfast together with an open dialogue around student achievement, the culture and climate of the school and any topics that you may bring to the table. I look forward to working with you and increasing our home-school connection. MESA is implementing a new reading initiative set to begin October 24, 2023. Your support is needed to ensure its success. Every day from 2:00-2:15 the school will Drop Everything and Read. Our data reveals that our scholars need to practice reading each and every day. Please keep in mind that school is still in session until 2:20 and that learning must take place from the start to the end of each day. In addition to this initiative every scholar is required to read at home Monday through Friday for a minimum of twenty minutes in grades K-2 and thirty minutes in grades 3-8. Please ensure that our scholars are adhering to this requirement.

Finally, MESA scholars and staff participate in daily crew meetings. Crew supports the social and emotional well being of our scholars and staff. Each day we greet each other and remind ourselves of the Habits of Scholarship. Please continue to discuss with our scholars the following:

- Being respectful and valuing each others opinion
- Resolving conflict by mediation with others and restoring the harm
- Holding ourselves accountable for our actions
- Having integrity and exemplifying our best selves

There are still many of you that I have yet to meet, please know that my door is always open and I will continue to work for the betterment of Mesa with the scholars at the forefront of all decisions made.

Please note that private, charter and choice schools have their own criteria for the admission process so you would need to reach out to them individually.
